They felt that they had let down both current church members and previous generations of members, who had for so long, promoted Christian Ministries within the building's walls. The sale of these buildings felt as though the torch, which had been passed forward for decades, was now being extinguished.

After some time, the Pastor's disappointment was replaced with a feeling of peace that God was calling the Community of Christ to a new mission. A mission beyond the boundary of the buildings.
